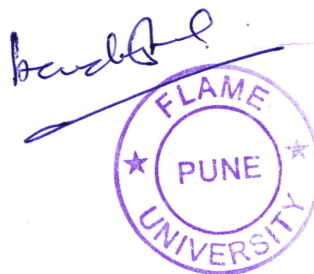


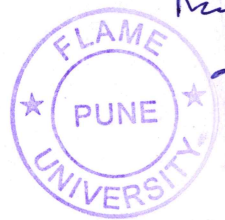

Scholarship Policy

RULES AND MAINTENANCE



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1 Student Scholarships

FLAME University has instituted merit and need-based scholarships to encourage students to pursue their studies at FLAME University. While some scholarships are offered at the time of admission based on the overall scores in the admission process and other extraordinary achievements of the student, for instance, in academics, sports, and arts, other scholarships may be awarded after admission on application by the student, based on their performance in the program that they are pursuing at FLAME University.

1.1 Scholarships at the time of Admission

Tuition fees of students who have been awarded scholarships at the time of admission will be adjusted by the amount of the scholarship awarded. The semester-wise payable tuition fee is the net amount, after deducting the scholarship award. The annual scholarship award is divided equally between semesters.

1.2 Award of Scholarships for Full-Time Students after Admission

1.2.1 To encourage and reward exceptional academic performance, scholarships may be awarded to students who are pursuing a program at FLAME University, provided they fulfill the following conditions at the time of application for scholarship:

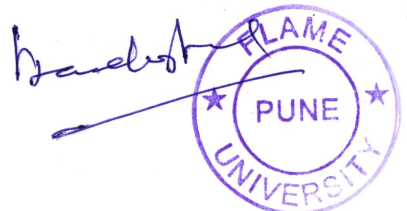
1. Rank in the top 5% in their respective batch.
2. Have a minimum CGPA of 8.50.

1.2.2 The list of meritorious students shall be prepared at the end of every academic year and any student in the top 5% who is not on scholarship may be awarded a scholarship for the remainder of the program.

1.2.3 The scholarship award is a fixed amount.

1.2.4 If a student who is on scholarship features in the top 5% of the batch and his/her scholarship award is less than the amount fixed for that year, then the scholarship of such students shall be increased to match the fixed amount.

1.2.5 The tuition fees of students who have been awarded scholarships or have their scholarship amount increased during program will be adjusted by the amount of the scholarship only for that component of the fees that is payable to the University after the date of the award.



1.2.6 The rules for maintenance of scholarship shall be as per Section 3.



2 Emergency Tuition-fund Support

Emergency tuition support may be provided to students who face a financial need caused by circumstances beyond their control while enrolled as a student. To be eligible for this support, there has to be a loss of funding resulting from a death, serious illness, or any other circumstance which makes it difficult for the student to generate funds on their own.

3 Maintenance of the Scholarship

The following regulations apply to all scholarship students:

- 3.1.1 The scholarship award will not be paid to the scholarship recipient but adjusted against the tuition fee.
- 3.1.2 The continuation of the scholarship is contingent on students maintaining a CGPA of 7.00 or more in every semester of the program in which the student has enrolled in. However, considering exceptional circumstances, if a scholarship student is not able to maintain a CGPA of 7.00 or more in two consecutive semesters, the scholarship award will be withdrawn for the rest of the duration of the program.
- 3.1.3 Students studying in partner institutions on student exchange or other programs must ensure that they meet the minimum credit requirements and maintain a FLAME equivalent CGPA of 7.00.
- 3.1.4 Students who have been awarded scholarships are expected to provide service to institutional activities.
- 3.1.5 The workload of such students may be no more than 12 hours per week for the semesters in which the student receives the scholarship award.
- 3.1.6 In case a scholarship student withdraws from the program, the student must refund the scholarship amount that the University has already disbursed.
- 3.1.7 The Scholarship Committee reviews the scholarships from time to time and reserves the right to alter, modify, change or withdraw any of the provisions and policies.
- 3.1.8 Should any of the information given by the scholarship recipient be found inaccurate or false at any time during the program, the scholarship award will be withdrawn, and the recipient will either be charged full payment of fees immediately or will be dismissed from the degree program.

4 Dean's Scholarship for Additional Credits

This scholarship provides a fee waiver for all students who exceed the maximum credit requirement while maintaining good academic standing in the Institution.

- 4.1.1 Students must be enrolled as full-time students at FLAME University.
- 4.1.2 Students must exceed the maximum credit requirement set for their respective program of study.
- 4.1.3 Students must maintain good academic standing as defined by the university's policies.
- 4.1.4 The Additional Credits Scholarship provides a waiver for a portion or the entirety of the additional fees incurred due to exceeding the maximum credits at the end of their program of study.
- 4.1.5 The amount of the fee waiver will be determined based on the excess credits and the university's financial policies.
- 4.1.6 The Program Office will automatically identify eligible students based on their academic records and credit hours and the office of accounts will be intimated about the students awarded this scholarship.

5 Dean's Scholarship for Student Research

- 5.1.1 Students must be enrolled in a degree (UG or PG) program at the university.
- 5.1.2 The Dean's Scholarship is open to undergraduate and graduate students and covers the following activities of the students.
- 5.1.3 **Field Trips:** The scholarship will cover expenses related to approved field trips organized by university for regular courses. This includes transportation, accommodation, meals, and any required materials.
- 5.1.4 **Research Projects:** The scholarship will cover expenses directly associated with approved research projects, such as data collection, laboratory supplies, equipment, and travel expenses related to fieldwork.
- 5.1.5 **Conference Travel:** The scholarship will cover expenses for students attending conferences, including registration fees, transportation, accommodation, and meals. The conference should be directly relevant to the student's field of study.
- 5.1.6 **Funding Guidelines**

- 1.1 The scholarship amount will be determined based on the availability of funds and the merit of the applications.



1.2 Students may receive partial or full funding, depending on the nature of the activity and the allocated budget.

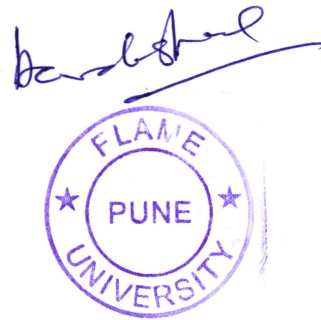
1.3 The scholarship funds will be disbursed directly to the students, either as a lump sum or in instalments, depending on the duration and nature of the approved activity.

1.4 Students who receive the scholarship are required to submit a detailed report or presentation upon completion of the activity, outlining their experiences, outcomes, and how the scholarship has contributed to their academic and personal growth.

1.5 For conference travel the scholarship will be subject to the following limits:

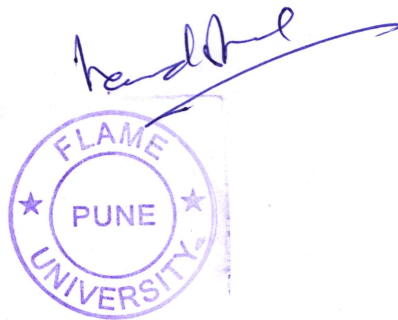
1. Rs.10,000 or 1/3rd of the expenses whichever is lower for national conferences.
2. Rs.30,000 or 1/3rd of the expenses whichever is lower for international conferences.

Please note that this policy is subject to change at the discretion of the university administration. It is the responsibility of the students to familiarize themselves with the current version of the policy.

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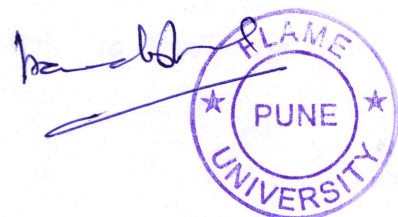

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
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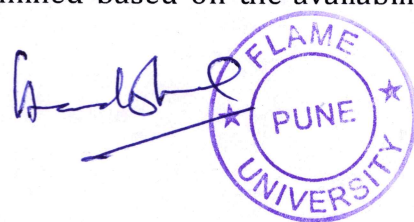
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
